
Reckham is a mutant Scotch Roman. We wanted to draw a Century Expanded that turned Clarendon when it got bolder, but somewhere along the way the serifs came unbracketed and our ideals of clarity and rigour had to make room for a few eccentric details. Then we couldn't decide on a degree of contrast, so we went with all of them. The No1 Series, with its hairline thin strokes, is nearly Didone, and its blackest weights are Fat Face. The nearly monoline No4 Series is typewriterish in the lightest styles and Egyptian in the darkest. No2 and No3 Series represent sturdy and quite readable steps along the way. The result isn't what we expected, but it must have been what we wanted. Along with 24 static styles, the complete Reckham family includes a variable font, so that users can fine-tune weight and contrast themselves.
